

ORDINANCE NO. 169

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE BLOCKING OF TRAFFIC BY RAILWAY TRAINS, AT INTERSECTIONS LEADING INTO THE FAIRVIEW ADDITION TO THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That from and after the date hereof, it shall be unlawful for any railway engine or train to block both intersections of roadways leading from the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, to the Fairview Addition in said City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, for a period of time longer than five (5) minutes, said roadways being Oak and Walnut Streets.

SECTION 2. That any Engineer or other employee operating such Railroad engine or train, or any other employee of such Railroad permitting such engine or train to block such intersection for a period of time in excess of five (5) minutes, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined in a sum not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), exclusive of costs.

SECTION 3. That nothing herein shall pertain to any Railroad engine or train traveling non-stop through the limits of the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, an immediate necessity exists; therefore, for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
