

ORDINANCE NO. 181

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A JOINT AIRPORT ZONING BOARD, BETWEEN THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA, AND ADAIR COUNTY, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING FOR THE METHOD OF APPOINTMENT FOR THE MEMBERS OF SUCH BOARD; PROVIDING POWERS OF SUCH JOINT BOARD; PROVIDING FOR TENURE OF THE MEMBERS OF SAID BOARD.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby created a Joint Airport Zoning Board, pursuant to Title 3 O.S., 1981, Sec. 101, et. Seq., and said Board's membership shall consist of one member to be appointed by the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, and one member appointed by Adair County Oklahoma, and a third member to be recommended by the Cherokee Tribe of Oklahoma and appointed by the two members appointed by the political subdivisions as aforesaid; that the terms of said members shall be three years; that the said Joint Board shall have the power to make its own rules and regulations governing its meeting and procedure, and any zoning regulations passed by said Joint Airport Zoning Board shall be effective upon adoption by a majority of its members; and that all ordinances and regulations passed by said Board shall be filed with the County Clerk of Adair County, Oklahoma.

SECTION 2. That the said Board is herewith empowered to create Airport Zoning Regulations for any airport hazard area that may exist, including dividing the area into zones, and may specify the land uses permitted and regulate and restrict the height to which structures may be erected and trees allowed to grow, and pass all other rules and regulations or ordinances not inconsistent with this Ordinance or the Statutes of the State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
