ORDINANCE NO. 26

An Ordinance prohibiting the discharge of fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Stilwell: making it a misdemeanor for vicilation thereof; providing a penalty therefor; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Stilwell:

Section 1. That from and after the passage and approval of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to discharge, set off or shoot, any Firecrackers, Torpedoes, Buzz Bombs, Aerial Bombs, Cannons, Roman Candles, Sky Rockets, or any other type or types of fireworks designed for such use, within the corporate limits of the City of Stilwell.

Section 2. That any person violating the provisions of Section 1 hereof shall be deemed sullity of a misdemeanor, and shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine and costs of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$19.95.

Section 3. Whereas an immediate necessity exists therefor, for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication.
