

ORDINANCE NO. 333

**AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH RULES AND RESTRICTIONS PERTAINING TO PROPERTY
IN THE CITY LIMITS OF STILWELL IN THE AREA DESIGNATED AS C.J. CARSON LAKE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STILWELL,
OKLAHOMA:**

The following rules and restrictions govern public use on the property of the City of Stilwell designated as C.J. Carson Lake:


- 1) Overnight camping is not permitted.
- 2) Only boats with electric motors may be operated on the lake. The operation of boats with internal combustion engines on the lake is prohibited. All boats operated on the lake must have a life preserve or life jacket for each person on board said boat.
- 3) Disposal of trash, refuse and debris is prohibited.
- 4) Private boat houses, ramps, docks and other facilities may not be constructed on C.J. Carson Lake.
- 5) Vandalism, theft and damage to city property is prohibited.
- 6) No person shall a) use threatening, abuse or indecent language, b) participate in a disorderly assemblage, c) publicly appear nude or intoxicated.
- 7) Swimming is not permitted.
- 8) Trespassing on property below C.J. Carson Lake Dam is prohibited.
- 9) Off road driving is prohibited, all motorized vehicles are required to stay on roads designated as open for public.
- 10) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully or neglectfully allow livestock to trespass on the property of the City of Stilwell.
- 11) Use of trotlines, throwlines, limblines, juglines and yo-yo's shall comply with state law.
- 12) Tournament fishing is prohibited.
- 13) It shall be unlawful for any person to disturb the peace of another or others by violent, obstreperous or improper conduct or carriage; by loud or unusual noise; or by unseemly, obscene, offensive or abusive language; or to insult another or others by such conduct or language; or to conduct himself in a disorderly manner.
- 14) Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a public offense and shall be fined the maximum fine including costs.

WHEREAS, an immediate necessity exists; therefore, for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
